The Biblical Basis for Being Set Free and Setting Others Free in Christ



- > Receiving Forgiveness from God is the FOUNDATION/SOURCE for recovering the lost art of forgiveness.
- > Being Forgiving toward others is the HEART of recovering the lost art of forgiveness.
- > Asking Forgiveness is...
 - **SUBMITTING** to the Father's *demand* that living in fellowship with Him and one another *be our greatest priority*. **HONORING** the Father's *desire* that His children remain in fellowship with Him and one another *as a family*.

Recovering the Lost Art of Giving Forgiveness

1. Why Should We Freely Give Forgiveness to Those Who Ask for It?

It Frees Us...

- To <u>SHOW</u> one another that freely *receiving forgiveness* from the Father has truly transformed as His children.
- > To MOVE from the attitude of *being forgiving* into the action of actually giving forgiveness.
- To <u>GIVE</u> to those asking forgiveness the same grace that the Father has given to each of us in Christ Jesus...again and again and again.
- > To **MODEL** *the way* the Father and the Son forgive repentant sinners who ask them for forgiveness.
- > To **BEAR** the fruit of the Spirit. Galatians 5:22-23; Ephesians 4:29-32
- > To **EXPERIENCE** God's forgiveness of us. *Matthew* 6:12, 14-15
- > To WORSHIP God without chastisement. Mark 11:25; Matthew 18:32-35

2. When Do I Freely Give Forgiveness?

> As soon as you are **REQUESTED** by the offender and possibly can. Luke 15:17-24

Bridging the Gap Between Biblical Learning and Radical Living

- Q1 Do I have to do it immediately when they ask? What if I need to process their request?
- A1 Discipleship is both a **DECISION** and a **DESTINATION**.

- Q2 What if they never come and ask or do not even realize what they have done or they are dead?
- A2 Our responsibility is to both <u>GO</u> to ask forgiveness and <u>GO</u> to give forgiveness. Matthew 5:23-24; 18:15-18
- > As soon as you are **<u>READY</u>** to worship God. *Mark* 11:25

3. How Do I Freely Forgive?

- > **<u>CHOOSE</u>** with your redeemed will to freely give the gift of forgiveness from your regenerate heart.
- > MAKE the promise to lift the burden of guilt and not remember the offense against them.
 - 1) I won't bring it up to the **PERSON** to use against them.
 - 2) I won't bring it up to **OTHERS** to use against them.
 - 3) I won't bring it up to **MYSELF** to use against them.
 - I won't let it be an <u>OBSTACLE</u> to viewing them as God views me in Christ.
- SEAL it with your behavior. *Ephesians* 4:31-32; Colossians 3:12-15
- > **TRUST** God with the ongoing process of remaining forgiving, keeping the promise, and showing kindness.

Bridging the Gap Between Biblical Learning and Radical Living

- Q1 Should I expect this to be easy and a one-time gift?
- A1 No! Remember that giving forgiveness is both a decision and a destination!
- Q2 Am I on my own in doing this?
- A2 No! Remember that your heavenly Father is in the forgiving business and the heart changing business!
- Q3 Is it humanly possible to "forgive & forget"?
- A3 No! No one can choose to erase the memory banks of the brain.

4. What Barriers Might I Face?

We May Be Tempted to Withhold Forgiveness

- > Due to a poor self-image that seeks to use the offense to gain attention and/or sympathy.
- > Due to a need to have control over others in order to be significant and powerful.
- Due to being too proud to admit we have been hurt and so try to minimize the offense and avoid humbling ourselves to give forgiveness.
- > Due to failing to see forgiveness as an act of grace and opportunity to trust the Lord.
- Due to a failure to be obedient.

Forgiveness is a "hard work miracle"!

How Can I Break Down These Barriers?

- > Remember to *not* forgive is *always* <u>COSTLIER</u> than to forgive.
- God never asks us to do anything that He has not first <u>DONE</u> for us in Christ and has <u>ENABLED</u> us to do in the Spirit.
- We do not have to be controlled by our feelings or a helpless prisoner of our past. John 8:32, 36
- Jesus Christ has <u>SPECIAL</u> grace for the bruised and wounded by the sins of others. Luke 4:18; Matthew 11:28-29; Isaiah 42:3-4
- > Reflect on how many **<u>TIMES</u>** a day God forgives you in Christ! *Ephesians* 4:32
- If you have really forgiven, it is never the 2nd, or 7th, or even the 20th time you have forgiven, it is always the FIRST TIME!

God and Give the Gift That Keeps on Giving!

Choose to cancel the debt that is owed you when you are asked and then thank the Lord a thousand times for the grace to remain forgiving, to keep the promise, and to show kindness like God in Christ has done for you...again and again and again!
